SAC: A TAPESTRY OF PARTNERSHIP

2023 was a year of working in partnership with communities, weaving together multiple strategies and approaches to ending the HIV and STI epidemics in the South. Communities led the way in making demands for policy change, increased support, and the end of stigma to improve health and access for all southerners.

With millions of people reached in our work, we championed and amplified messages of awareness and advocacy. Of our \$2.9M budget, 42% was used to support our communities through grants, travel support, event sponsorships, and more.

- Through the generous support of funding and impact partners, we equipped organizations in the South to create tapestries of change in their own backyards.
- Through Change the Pattern, quilts were made to honor the lives of southerners lost to AIDS-related illnesses.
- Through our annual Saving Ourselves Symposium, southern Black LGBTQIA+ communities were empowered and connected.
- Through the Gilead COMPASS Initiative, community-based organizations received resources and training to address HIV-related stigma.

These are just some examples of our commitment at Southern AIDS Coalition, and why we need your support in 2024 and beyond.







CHANGE THE PATTERN

Change the Pattern is a multi-year collaboration with a focus on increasing the presence of southerners, and communities of color, in the fabric of the AIDS Memorial Quilt through quilt displays and workshops. Programs also include community discussions about changes that need to happen locally to end the HIV epidemic, and end patterns of injustice. In 2023 our work took us to Louisiana, Tennessee, and Texas for multiday community activations! Change the Pattern is a collaboration with the National AIDS Memorial and Gilead Sciences.

We increased awareness about the AIDS Memorial Quilt and Change the Pattern through various earned media tactics, including news releases, urban radio PSA announcements, billboards, and local reports. Change the Pattern received a Bronze Anthem Award in Community Voice.

GILEAD COMPASS INITIATIVE


As part of our Gilead COMPASS Initiative® efforts to reduce HIV-related stigma, we partnered with 22 grantees, awarding a total of \$1,042,500. Our Community Outreach Associate, Marnina Miller, conducted multiple LEAD & Younity workshops this year. In the last quarter alone, the two programs had 68 participants. More impactful, the LEAD participants were able to conduct 12 Teachbacks, concluding with over 280 people living with HIV receiving the tools to advocate to end the epidemic, from October to December 2023.

PUBLIC POLICY & ADVOCACY

Overarching SAC Policy Priorities:

- Increasing awareness of the disproportionate impact of HIV on the South and the need for new, flexible resources that can be used to mount an effective response to the epidemic.
- Protecting and promoting access to high quality health care and essential support services, including Ryan White Program, Medicaid, Medicare, the ACA, HOPWA, and private insurance.
- Ensuring that Southerners living with HIV and other marginalized communities are free from stigma and discrimination.
- Protecting and promoting access to a full range of prevention interventions and harm reduction services across the South.

Actionable Policies:

- Support Medicaid Expansion in 7 remaining states in the South.
- Public Health separated from law enforcement
 modernize HIV criminalization laws
- Stabilize or increase HIV funding, specifically in Southern States.
- Expand PrEP access through various vehicles, such as a federal National PrEP Program and through scope of work expansion for pharmacists in Community Pharmacies.











PUBLIC POLICY & ADVOCACY

In 2023, the Southern AIDS Coalition (SAC) engaged in several critical initiatives aimed at reducing stigma, increasing funding for HIV specific and other related programs, and improving healthcare access for underserved populations. Highlights of events include, joining Tennessee advocates for their Day on the Hill, where significant funding was restored and increased for HIV initiatives, demonstrating SAC's pivotal role in the South of both being a bridge and a megaphone for advocacy. SAC's engagements spanned from advocacy at AIDS Watch 2023, to educational webinars like "The Tennessee Decision," which explored regional policy impacts on health and "End the Epidemic," which focused on policy, pathways, and pitfalls across HIV.

SAC proudly assisted community members in Tenessee, including partner Jimmy Samuels. Our support made it possible for these advocates to voice concerns in DC and at several conferences.




